



Radio Sounds

Cups for Horse Gallops:

Clapping two cups together, especially if they're hollow and made of a harder material, can mimic the sound of horse hooves on cobblestone.

Aluminum Foil for Fire:

Crinkling aluminum foil can sound like a fire crackling.

Rice or Pasta in a Container for Rain:

Pouring rice or pasta into a metal or plastic container can sound like rain falling. Adjust the intensity of the rainstorm with how fast or slow you pour.

Sheet of Paper for Wind:

Want a windy day? Simply wave a large sheet of paper back and forth. The faster you wave, the stormier it gets.

Water in a Bottle for Ocean Waves:

Partially fill a plastic bottle with water and tilt it back and forth to create the soothing sound of ocean waves lapping against the shore.

Buttons in a Box for Footsteps:

A box filled with buttons can mimic the sound of footsteps on a hard surface. Shake it rhythmically, and you have a walking sound effect.
