TELEPHONE

- Clue 1: This invention replaced candles and oil lamps for lighting.
- Clue 2: It allows us to see when it's dark outside.
- Clue 3: It's powered by electricity and has a small filament inside.

LIGHT BULB

- Clue 1: This device makes washing clothes much easier than scrubbing them by hand.
- Clue 2: It has a drum that spins clothes to clean them.
- Clue 3: Before this, people washed clothes by hand in a tub or river.

WASHING MACHINE

- Clue 1: This invention made it possible to travel long distances quickly.
- Clue 2: It has four wheels and is powered by an engine.
- Clue 3: Before this, people relied on horses or trains for long-distance travel.

CAR

- Clue 1: This invention changed the way we travel across the world.
- Clue 2: It has wings and an engine, and can fly through the sky.
- Clue 3: Before this, people could only travel by ship or train for long distances.

AIRPLANE

- Clue 1: This appliance keeps food fresh by keeping it cold.
- Clue 2: It replaced iceboxes and is now in most homes.
- Clue 3: You store perishable items like milk, meat, and vegetables in it.

REFRIGERATOR

- Clue 1: This invention allows you to watch moving pictures and hear sound.
- Clue 2: It became the main form of entertainment in most households.
- Clue 3: Before it, people gathered around the radio for news and stories.

TELEVISION

- Clue 1: This device helps you tell the time.
- Clue 2: It has numbers and hands that move around a circle.
- Clue 3: You might have one on the wall or wear a small one on your wrist.

CLOCK

- Clue 1: This device helps clean floors by sucking up dirt and dust.
- Clue 2: It's powered by electricity and makes a loud noise when it's working.
- Clue 3: Before this, people used brooms or carpet beaters to clean.

VACUUM

- Clue 1: This invention turns bread into a warm, crispy snack.
- Clue 2: It has slots where you place bread, and when it's ready, the bread pops up.
- Clue 3: You use it for breakfast, often with butter or jam.

TOASTER

- Clue 1: This invention mixes food together quickly.
- Clue 2: It's commonly used to make smoothies, soups, or milkshakes.
- Clue 3: You place ingredients inside a container, and it blends them into a smooth liquid.

BLENDER

- Clue 1: This device captures pictures so you can remember moments.
- Clue 2: It has a lens, and you press a button to take a photo.
- Clue 3: Before phones, people carried this to take family portraits and vacation pictures.

CAMERA

- Clue 1: This invention smooths out wrinkles in clothes.
- Clue 2: It's heated up and then pressed onto fabric to make it flat and neat.
- Clue 3: People used this to look sharp for work or special occasions.

IRON

- Clue 1: This invention helps you stitch fabric together quickly.
- Clue 2: It uses a needle and thread to make clothing or quilts.
- Clue 3: Before it, people sewed by hand, which took much longer.

SEWING MACHINE

- Clue 1: This small item is placed on letters and packages to send them through the mail.
- Clue 2: It has a picture or design on it, and it's often colorful.
- Clue 3: You collect them, and they're used to pay for sending mail.

STAMP

- Clue 1: This invention heats up food quickly.
- Clue 2: It's often used to warm up leftovers or cook frozen meals.
- Clue 3: You put your food inside and press a button to start it.

MICROWAVE

- Clue 1: This device blows air to help you cool down when it's hot.
- Clue 2: It has blades that spin, creating a breeze.
- Clue 3: It's often used in the summer to keep the air fresh and moving.

FAN

- Clue 1: This invention helps you see in the dark.
- Clue 2: It runs on batteries and is portable, so you can take it anywhere.

- Clue 1: This tool is used for writing or drawing.
